

Celebrate National Canadian Film Day With a Free Online Screening of the 1979 Classic Film, MEATBALLS

The Oakville Festival of Film and Arts is proud to partner with REEL CANADA for the 8th annual National Canadian Film Day, on April 21, 2021.

Tuesday, April 6th, 2021 - Toronto, ON - The Oakville Festival of Film and Arts (OFFA) and Sheridan College will be partnering with REEL CANADA and National Canadian Film Day (NCFD) to present one of Canada's most beloved classic movies, by one of our most celebrated Directors, Ivan Reitman.

This year a very special FREE screening of the Canadian-made, coming-of-age classic, *MEATBALLS*, will be presented virtually with more than 1000 live community screenings, in hundreds of communities from coast to coast, participating in one of the largest virtual screenings in the country.

The film will be available for 48 hours beginning on April 21st at 9 am, with a live Q&A with Director Ivan Reitman, Casting Direct and Actor Jack Blum (who portrayed Spaz, who is also the founder of REEL CANADA), and actor Kate Lynch (who portrayed Roxanne) to follow at 9:00pm EDT. The Q&A will be hosted by OFFA co-founder Wendy Donnan, and the Q&A will be moderated by Canadian media icon, Jennifer Valentyne, a 25-year veteran of Breakfast Television, Global News Morning, and the host of The Bachelor, and The Bachelorette.

MEATBALLS is still one of Canada's highest grossing movies, and featured breakout star, Bill Murray. Screenwriters include Harold Ramis, Len Blum, Daniel Goldberg, and Janis Allen.

On why the MEATBALLS is such a perfect selection for this year's event, REEL CANADA Director, Jack Blum explains: "In a year when we all need to feel good, MEATBALLS is the ultimate Canadian feel-good movie. It's theme song 'Are you Ready for the Summer?' pretty well summarizes how we're all feeling right now, doesn't it?"

On this year's partnership with REEL Canada, OFFA Executive Director, Wendy Donnan says, "OFFA has been proud to be a very active partner and supporter of NCFD and the team at REEL CANADA for many years, and continues to support Canadian film and our industry at our June festival and at all of our events. It's really exciting to be bringing Ivan Reitman back home, even virtually, for National Canadian Film Day!"

More than a dozen major broadcast and streaming partners will run special programming, making great Canadian films available to anyone with a tv, computer, or wireless device.
